Roles and Responsibilities

Collaboration between iScoil and partner agencies enables both parties to provide an effective blended learning experience for young people. Any partnership relies on clarity of responsibilities and expectations and we work together with local services and steering groups to achieve the best fit for each centre based on assessment of the needs of young people in their community. Since 2009, iScoil has worked with a range of different services and agencies and has gained considerable experience in identifying the key components that contribute to a successful blended learning centre. The Support Worker Role

iScoil students often have a diverse range of complex needs. The face-to-face support and encouragement provided by Support Workers is a vital contributing factor to the successful engagement of each student. iScoil has spent a number of years working successfully with a wide range of partner agencies and this experience has enabled us to compile a list of responsibilities and recommended competencies. The table below outlines some of the key components for a Support Worker in a blended learning environment.
